Dear People of God

Jesus' parable speaks about the nature of prayer and our relationship with God. It does this by contrasting two very different attitudes towards prayer. The Pharisee, who represented those who take pride in their religious practices, exalted himself at the expense of others. Absorbed with his own sense of self-satisfaction and self-congratulation, his boastful prayer was centered on his good religious practices, rather than on God's goodness, grace and forgiveness. Rather than humbling himself before God and asking for God's mercy and assistance, this man praised himself while despising those he thought less worthy. The Pharisee tried to justify himself before God and those he despised; but only God can justify us.

The tax collector, who represented those despised by religious-minded people, humbled himself before God and begged for his mercy. His prayer was heard by God because he had true sorrow for his sins. He sought God with humility rather than with pride.

"Lord Jesus, may your love and truth transform my life - my inner thoughts, intentions and attitudes, and my outward behavior, speech and actions. Where I lack charity, patience and kindness, help me to embrace your merciful love and to seek the good of my neighbor, even those who cause me offense. May I always love as you have loved and forgive others as you have forgiven."

Bl. Michael Rua (Born in Turin on June 9, 1837, the youngest of nine children, Michael came to the Oratory in 1852. One day, Don Bosco told him: "We will go halves in everything." He was among the first group to whom Don Bosco suggested the formation of the Salesian Society. For 36 years, Michael was Don Bosco's closest collaborator in all stages of the development of the Congregation. He was professed in 1855, was first spiritual director of the Congregation at 22 (1859) and was ordained in 1860. He became the

first director of the Mirabello College at 26 (1863-1865) and, later, was Vicar of Valdocco, with its 700 pupils and of the Society. He was administrator of the Letture Cattoliche (Catholic Readings), responsible for formation (1869) and for personnel. In 1875, he became Director General of the Salesian Sisters and he accompanied Don Bosco on his journeys.
